

New PIT Weekly Update: A reflection of regional artisanship

The transformed PIT is designed to reflect the history, natural beauty, innovation and spirit of the Pittsburgh region. Building "Pittsburgh" into the transformed PIT took the work of local craftspeople — artisans who were engaged to complete special finishes within the restrooms of the new PIT terminal.

Handcrafted tiles by <u>Limelight Tile</u> will be on display on the walls and behind the mirrors of the new terminal's restrooms. Limelight Tile is a local family-owned business that creates one-of-a-kind ceramic tile designs.

3D printed tiles by <u>Brian Peters Studio</u> will also be featured in the new terminal's restrooms, on display in the baby-changing areas. Studio namesake Brian Peters is a trained architect and Pittsburgh entrepreneur who employs 3D printing into ceramic works of art.

Finally, forged aluminum coat hooks and vases by <u>Transit Forge</u> will also be installed in the new terminal's restrooms. The vases can hold live flowers, meant to contribute to a more enriching passenger experience. Located nearby in Cambridge Springs, PA, Transit Forge creates a variety of sculptural, functional and architectural metalwork.
