

Pittsburgh cuts ribbon for PIT's new terminal

On Saturday, more than 300 guests gathered for PIT's Ribbon Cutting Ceremony to commemorate the new terminal, including airport leadership, airline partners, elected officials, community organizations, labor and construction teams, as well as other key stakeholders. The event symbolized the culmination of a collective effort that built the new PIT terminal that reflects Pittsburgh's identity and its future.

The ceremony featured remarks from PIT CEO Christina Cassotis and numerous local, state and federally elected officials, including Allegheny County Executive Sara Innamorato; Southwestern Pennsylvania Commission Executive Director and former Allegheny County Executive Rich Fitzgerald; U.S. Sen. Dave McCormick; U.S. Representatives Chris Deluzio, Mike Kelly and Summer Lee; Gov. Josh Shapiro and Lt. Gov. Austin Davis; State Sen. Devlin Robinson; State Representative Valerie Gaydos; and Allegheny County Council President Pat Catena.

Leaders recognized the extensive airline, government and community partnerships—private and public—that were essential to the project's success from start to finish. The new terminal is the centerpiece of PIT's successful transition to an origin-and-destination airport and will serve as the region's "front door" once it opens to the public later this fall.
